

In order to access the Online Dictionary you will also need a Login Code to enter as 'email address' and an additional Password. These may also be obtained from Gillian. RSCM Awards to our Exec. President and Hon. Vice-President

The RSCM reports: 'Two academics are also being honoured with Fellowships; Dr Ian Sharp, has been a long-standing and loyal member of both the RSCM Council and the RSCM Liverpool Area Committee. He was also Foundation Dean of Liverpool Hope University. Ian has led many events, worked as an examiner and composer, and written for Church Music Quarterly, the RSCM's magazine. Professor J.R. (Dick) Watson, Emeritus Professor of English at Durham University, is being honoured for his tireless contribution to the editing of hymns. He was General Editor of The Canterbury Dictionary of Hymnology published last year.' Awards will be presented by Lord Brian Gill, Chairman of the RSCM Council and Scotland's most senior judge, during a special Celebration Day service in Hereford Cathedral on Saturday 4th October 2014. "It always gives me great pleasure to personally present these awards," he said. "They are our annual opportunity to honour and thank those who have given distinguished service to the cause of church music and to RSCM in particular."

2014 marks the 250th Anniversary of John Newton's arrival at Olney; his ministry began there on Sunday, 27th May, 1764. The BBC has recently been to Olney, filming two items for a three part documentary series *Eighteenth Century Music*. This is going to be presented by Suzy Klein who was filmed in Olney giving some background to Newton's hymn, *Amazing Grace* and William Cowper's poem, *The Negro's Complaint*. The Whole Booke of Psalmes—a record sale

Last year the forthcoming sale of *The Whole Booke of Psalmes* was reported (Secretary's Newsletter: No.57: Summer 2013). The book, universally known as *The Bay Psalm Book* and generally acknowledged to be the first book printed in America, was produced in 1640 in the Massachusetts Bay Colony by the Congregationalist Puritans who left England in search of religious freedom.

The book was sold last November at Sotheby's in New York for \$14.2 million (£8.5 million)—the highest sum ever paid at auction for a printed book!
